Chosen, to follow Jesus!

During the Season of Lent, people often choose to give up something they enjoy or something that may be holding them back from going deeper in their relationship with God. In essence, this practice is a kind of a spiritual fast for the individual to help them keep their focus on Jesus as we journey with Christ to the cross. And while I support anyone who chooses to avoid eating certain foods (like sugar or meat, or soda, or carbs), or to refrain from indulging in activities that might be impacting their faith formation (like drinking too much, sleeping too much, working too much), I often encourage individuals to try adding a Spiritual practice into their routines instead.

This is because in the past, when I have tried fasting during Lent, I have found that oftentimes when we deprive ourselves of the things or activities we enjoy, we aren't always successful. But maybe that is the whole point, because as we try to avoid certain temptations to quit, we are learning to place our trust in God and ask the Lord for help. After all, it does wonders for our faith (and yes our egos too) when we don't give up and we make it to Easter Sunday. (To this day, I remember the year I gave up meat for Lent and how good I felt spiritually after a successful 40 day journey.) And yet, if we try adding a Spiritual practice into our lives (such as: worshipping weekly, daily Scripture study, prioritizing prayer, volunteering more, upping our financial giving, daily devotions, or weekly Bible study) we may experience an even deeper transformation in our lives and in our faith.

Each year, I like to offer up a theme for Lent and this year's theme is, "Chosen to Walk with Jesus!" My hope is that it will be a reminder that we have all been called to follow Jesus, just as he asked his original disciples to follow him! It also goes well with the Bible study I am hoping to offer after worship on Sunday mornings (11:30am), which will explore the new Biblical series, "The Chosen," and how it compares to the stories we read about Christ in the New Testament. Please click the link in the e news for instructions for watching the T.V series "the chosen." Pastor Ryan is also more than happy to come help you find a way to experience it for yourself. (Seems like a good way for us to get to know each other a little better).

Aside from offering up a Bible Study that connects with, "The Chosen," there will also be other opportunities to help you in your Lenten journey. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, you are invited to join us for worship and receive an anointing with ash as the cross is marked on your forehead. Those who attend the service will be encouraged to take a grey silicone bracelet, featuring an ash cross with the words, "Remember you are dust. To dust you shall return," that you will be encouraged to wear throughout Lent as a reminder of our mortal nature and our need for redemption.

I know that there have been a number of individuals in our Congregation who have lost loved ones during the past few years, and I'm certain that there are people who have also dealt with other types of tragedies or loss that has caused them heartache and pain. It is my hope to help you find some healing and to perhaps also assist you in finding ways to deal with your grief.

During Lent, I am starting a grief support group, by offering a special Bible study on grief to help lay the foundation for the group.

If you would like to know more about the Bible study, see a description from the author of the leader's guide: "Born out of her own deep grief experience, Rev. Rev. Collette Broady Grund offers a six-session study, using Scripture to access and process grief. Each Scripture story is paired with one or more stages of grief. Participants are invited to access their grief through an opening meditation, then read the Scripture story and reflect on questions. Each session closes with a blessing, meant to remind participants that God is present and at work in the grieving process.
