#### What is a Disciple?

I often find myself wondering how many Christians these days truly understand what it means to be a disciple. There are some, I imagine, who assume that if we are baptized in the Christian faith and are a follower of Christ, then we are automatically a disciple. For others, discipleship is all about following certain religious rules and traditions that help us live out our existence in this world. And of course, there are also people who believe that it is all about learning to embrace the things Jesus taught and to try to do the things that he did.

In his book, *In the Dust of the Rabbi: Learning to Live as Jesus lived*, Ray Vander Laan seems to wonder the same thing. He writes, "Contemporary Christianity does not always make discipleship central to the faith. Many who call themselves Christians don't even know what a disciple is." Mr. Laan's reasoning for this is because he believes that modern day believers don't really have a basic knowledge of the world and the people of Jesus' day, and because of this they fail to grasp what the Biblical writers assumed their readers were familiar with. For example, things like Near Eastern geography, history, and culture.

During the season of Lent, as we walk with Jesus to the cross, we will be learning about the people and events found in Scripture and will study their geographical, historical, and cultural contexts. This will be done through a special video series filmed at Biblically significant sites such as Galilee, Priene, and Didyma. In fact, on Wednesday nights during our Holden Evening Prayer service we will watch Ray Lander Laan in these locations as we explore the following episodes: 1. When the Rabbi says, "Come" 2. When the Rabbi Says, "Go" 3. The Presence of God: A Countercultural Community 4. Living Stones 5. The Very Words of God. (*Please note that the episodes range from 24 to 30 minutes, so worship will be about an hour, but they are well worth it!*)

To help us unpack this amazing video series, we will be using a corresponding study guide for adult education on Sunday mornings after worship. The books should cost around \$8 and we are hoping to have some copies at the church available for purchase. And if you want to get a jump on the study you can find it on amazon.com (*the title is mentioned earlier in my article*). So, rather than giving up something during Lent, as many tend to do, perhaps you might consider adding to your spiritual learning by joining me to discover what discipleship is all about. The class will begin on Sunday February 25<sup>th</sup> following the viewing of the first episode on February 21<sup>st</sup>.

Serves 24

Hamburger - 4 pounds Onion - 2 cups chopped Tomato sauce - 3 - 15 ounce cans or 2- 29 ounce cans (add 1-15 ounce can of stewed tomatoes along with 2 cans tomato sauce if preferred) Garlic salt - 1 Tablespoon Chili powder - 1 Tablespoon

Brown hamburger with the onion. Drain off excess fat. Season hamburger with garlic salt and chili powder. Add tomato sauce/stewed tomatoes. Cook over low heat and simmer 30-45 minutes. Chill and freeze in gallon sized zip lock bags. Deliver to church.

Each recipe should fill 2 bags.
