## Life-Long Discipleship

Anytime we observe or experience extraordinary weather, or some rare celestial event taking place on our planet, it isn't hard for us to imagine that rumors will fly that perhaps it was a sign of a forthcoming apocalypse or God's judgment upon our nation. And I can somewhat understand, that for the conspiracy theorists out there, it isn't too much of a stretch for them to see something like a solar eclipse as a symbol of the darkness in our world extinguishing the light. After all, with the recent protests by hate groups in our Country, and the numerous threats from terrorists and countries like North Korea, China, or Russia warning us of an inevitable nuclear attack, it isn't too hard for panic and anxiety to cause people to wonder if the end of the world is at hand.

In the *Word for Everyday* Alvin Rogness writes, "We live with an uneasy feeling that catastrophe may be just around the corner. We are human, and as such are dependent and independent beings. We know that we don't have everything under control. In a twinkling of an eye our lives can be changed or gone." He goes on to remind us that although we can't be sure what will happen today or tomorrow, we are to remember that as Disciples of Christ we need to continually remind ourselves that our lives in God are sure! In fact, not only does he provide us with the basic necessities of life such as air, food, and water, he has also taken care of our eternal future through the death of Jesus on the cross. Our eternal existence with the creator of the universe is assured, and instead of worrying we are called to participate in the kingdom of God as we seek to be disciples who not only spend a lifetime learning about God, but who also put into practice all the wonderful things we are taught by Him.

As September begins there will be a number of wonderful opportunities for us to grow in our knowledge and understanding of the Lord. #### Confirmation

If you have a child in your home who is entering into 7<sup>th</sup> grade this year, you are encouraged to attend the Confirmation orientation on September 21<sup>st</sup> at 7:30pm. We will meet to go over expectations, and this year's curriculum, and we will also play some games so that we can get to know one another. As you consider whether your child will participate, you are encouraged to take some time to reflect on the vows that were made when your child was baptized. For example: A promise was made that you would nurture them in faith and prayer, that you would teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments (this is taught in Confirmation) and that you would place in their hands the Holy Scriptures (they receive a Bible.)

## First Lutheran Brunch Bunch

Are you someone who enjoys going out for lunch or breakfast on Sunday mornings after church, but aren't a fan of eating alone? Perhaps you might consider joining the pastor for brunch on the last Sunday of every month? After all, one of the best ways to get to know other people is by sitting down with them and sharing a meal together. Think about all the times in the Bible that Jesus sat down at meals with his followers and those who needed to be in his presence. Not that Pr. Ryan is comparing himself to Christ, but he is hoping that it might be a fun way to become more acquainted with the friends and members of First Lutheran. Please note that a sign-up sheet will be posted on the bulletin board at the beginning of each month, and you are encouraged to sign up one time at first (to give others a chance to attend), but on the day of Brunch if there is a free spot you can always fill it. The goal is to get to know each other, and to also try a different restaurant in our area each month (the name of the place will be posted on the sign-up sheet). Also, we will each receive an individual check & cover the cost of our own meal.

## Congregation and Community Care Committee

Perhaps you've seen the poster of Jesus standing outside a door and, presumably, knocking. I suppose most people think Jesus is knocking on the door to ask if He can come in. Have you ever thought that He is knocking to ask us to come out with him in ministry?

A big part of doing ministry is reaching out beyond our church walls to the people in our community by sharing our faith. We often do this through our words, but we can also do that through our actions, such as those endeavors of our Social Ministry Committee, like providing school supplies for neighborhood kids, or items for moms and babies. But another important way to do so is what we call Evangelism, which is formally defined as "the spreading of the Christian gospel by public preaching or personal witness," but which we might call "God's Work. Our Hands." And, after all, Evangelical is our middle name!

While Social Ministry does a wonderful job addressing needs in the community, our new Congregation and Community Care Committee is looking to offer opportunities to reach out to our neighbors and also tend to some of our own. We might, for example, have a water station on Blackburn Road during a 10K run, providing hydration for those literally running by the church. What about a special welcome to new families moving into our area, or welcoming students back to school by greeting the drivers of the cars who pass our church as they pickup their kids from Jefferson?

There are also things we can do to support the folks who attend First by doing things like helping people who can no longer drive find a ride to church or perhaps a doctor's appointment. Maybe we'll get some meals together for someone who has lost a loved one or for a family who has welcomed a new baby. I'm guessing you have some ideas you can share with us, because we welcome your input, your help, and we could definitely use some members to be a part of our committee.
